Ginsburg Departs As Lewinsky's Attorney

Newly Graduated Carnahan Steps In

WASHINGTON (June '98) -- Bill Ginsburg, who confounded Washington's legal community with his uniquely free-wheeling defense of Monica Lewinsky, is out as the former White House intern's attorney. In Ginsburg's place, Lewinsky has hired two top-notch Washington attorneys: Elden Carnahan, a former student, and Sue Lin Chong who runs a prostatron device. Ms. Chong had recently sponsored a class action suit against her new partner for some shady dealings he had in an illegal gambling operation known as *The Rotisserie*. That matter is still pending.

Lewinsky's spokeswoman, Judy Smith, said Ginsburg and Lewinsky were parting "by mutual agreement" a legal term that roughly translates into: 'she ran out of money.' Ginsburg told Depravda he was not fired, but had been in discussion with Lewinsky, her father, Bernard Lewinsky and spokeswoman Smith "for some time" a legal term which roughly translates as "I quit as soon

as I saw they were going to fire me." Ginsburg returned to his civil law practice in California while the hungry new attorney Carnahan, fresh out of law school, completely broke and with massive student loan debt moved in and took over.

One of the primary objectives of Lewinsky's new legal team is to establish a more professional, cordial and an especially profitable relationship with Independent Counsel Ken Starr in hopes of avoiding indictment of the former White House intern. If that doesn't work then "we'll strap him into the prostatron and give it a whirl" added co-counsel Chong. According to Smith, "There was a lot of personal bitterness and resentment with Ginsburg and Starr. It got personal and it got ugly. This [prostatron] changes the dynamic." Smith said Lewinsky's legal team has as its objectives "getting rich quick, bleeding the client's family dry and, time permitting, avoiding indictment for the client."

Ginsburg, a longtime Lewinsky family friend, brought some criticism upon himself with unlawyer-like comments: "Bite me!" "I've got your subpoena right here!" and "Summon this!" among them. Describing his relationship with the Lewinsky family, he said, "I was there at the beginning. I kissed that girl's inner thighs when she was six days old." There are no reports on when/if this practice ever stopped and the new defense team is apparently in detailed negotiations focusing on this very same point.



In a written statement, Starr's spokesman said Starr respects Lewinsky's new lawyers (which translates as: I'm gonna have these guys for lunch). "Judge Starr has known Ellen and Sue Lynn for many years, has followed their careers with enthusiasm and has a great deal of respect for both of them (that is: let the games begin).

Meanwhile independent prosecutor Ken Starr has summoned Washington resident Ms. Kitty Thuermer to testify regarding her relationship with the President and to what extend the President has instructed her to lie about it. Ms. Thuermer has protested the summons claiming never to have met the man, however, when our investigative reporters uncovered the incriminating photo at left. Ms. Thuermer declined comment and refused to return our reporter's calls - a clear indication of guilt and compliance in the cover-up.

Busch's is a short drive away from the hotel. We will be in our own room and will have the usual fun/games there immediately following dinner.



Moving to an Organically Based Evaluation of Loser Potential

Early last February, 12 Losers were invited to the offices of the Washington Post for the purpose of finishing some cold Chinese food. The 12 were chosen on the basis of rankings published by our Esteemed Statistician in our Unesteemed Journal. The rankings themselves are an extrapolation of weekly ink samples taken from the results of the ongoing contest in the Sunday Style section. While the statistical methods employed are sound, the basis upon which ink is awarded in the first place is highly subjective. Questions arise as to whether the 12 Losers selected were the appropriate 12, and if so, whether the rankings within the group were accurate. While it could be argued that it would be difficult to find a reliable objective measurement to replace the current subjective method (which is based on the judgement of an unstable lunatic who is the fruit of generations of pampered indolence and unhealthy inbreeding), the goal of an objective measurement remains laudable if elusive.

If the leeks survive until next March, they will be ranked based on weight and length and compared with the final official Year 6 Loser rankings. They will then be eaten.




